Damselfly Nymph:

The next fly tying session will be held at the Odd Fellows Hall in San Luis Obispo on Thursday, March 5th at 6:30. Jim Snodgrass will demonstrate how to tie a Damselfly nymph. Jim is interested in the Damselfly nymph, because he heard it is a simple fly pattern that catches a wide variety of fish. Though Jim

has not fished with this fly yet, he is eager to try it out.

Rob Snowwhite was the creator of the Damselfly nymph. Rob is based in northern Virginia and the Washington DC area where he specialized in urban and suburban fly fishing for warm water species within the Potomac River Watershed. Rob is a Fly Fishing guide that caters to anglers of all skill levels and abilities.

Materials:

The following are the materials that will be used for the Damselfly:

- Thread - 70 denier red 6/0
- Hook - 135 size 10 Dai-Rika or equivalent
- Eyes - Beaded chain, medium
- Tail - Rainbow Krystal flash & olive Ostridge plum
- Body - Ostridge plum long stems, olive

All materials will be supplied, but be sure and bring 6/0 thread in red. For the best results, please bring Sally Hansen Hard as Nails to finish off the fly.
