

JEFF PUTNAM

Spey Fishing

Jeff traded in his spinning rod for his first fly fishing outfit at eleven years of age and started fishing many trout-filled streams in the Sierra Mountains. It was not long before fishing challenging gin-clear spring creeks, emerald green coastal steelhead rivers and fertile lakes all over the Western U.S. that Jeff realized fly fishing was more than just a sport. Jeff began fly-tying commercially at 13 and started guiding fly fishermen on Northern California's waters as early as age 16. He is a F.F.F. Certified Casting Instructor; both CI and THCI and was the 5th individual in the world to complete and pass the Double Handed Certification Test.

Jeff has worked many positions in the industry including retail fly shop sales, manufactures rep, fly fishing guide for 17 years throughout California, Montana and Colorado. Jeff has also been fortunate to have traveled to some of the top fly fishing destinations around the world in search of the ultimate fly fishing experience.

Jeff directed his self-titled series of instructional fly fishing videos DVD's, including the first 3D Blu-ray fly fishing video. He provides seminars and presentations for fly fishing expos, fly fishing clubs, fly shops, fly fishing manufacturers and corporate groups.

Jeff consults with fly fishing equipment manufacturers as a field tester and pro-staff member. He currently runs one of the largest west coast fly fishing schools and recently started his custom line of two-handed rods. Jeff enjoys fishing local waters for any fish species he can catch on a fly rod and possesses a true angling passion for steelhead on a spey rod, matching the hatch for spring creek trout and searching the saltwater flats.



SLFF Annual Fly Casting Clinics Schedule February 11th & March 4th

OUR GOAL IS TO MAKE YOU A MORE COMPLETE FLY FISHER

We have our fly-casting sessions earlier this year, hoping to avoid the rain and wind of last year. The dates are <u>February 11th and March 4th</u>.

For more than 20 years, through our club casting clinics, we've reached out to members of all casting levels. Many answered the call and greatly benefited from this program. Don't miss this opportunity to improve and fine tune your casting skills. You'll be glad you did!

Casting is (for most of us) the most important part of fly fishing that we have to work on and can MAKE OR BREAK YOUR DAY. Your grade in succeeding to catch fish, and having an enjoyable, relaxing fly-fishing experience, depends for a substantial part on your ability (or inability) to deliver a solid, well-presented cast in different situations.

WHEN: Saturday, February 11th and March 4th.

WHERE: Laguna Lake Park, San Luis Obispo (by the restrooms).

SIGN IN / GEAR UP: 8:15 to 8:50 am.

GROUP ASSIGNMENT: 8:50 to 9:00 am.

CASTING TIME : 9:00 to 11:00 am.

WHAT TO BRING: 5 to 8 wt rod /floating line with 7-9 ft leader + yarn (NO sink lines)

If you don't have this equipment, please contact Bernard Pieters to make

arrangements to use club rods.

The clinics are for members only and at NO COST.

FEBRUARY 11

Casting Mechanics / Spring Tune-up Plus, the **First Part** of Presentation Casts

This session is a must and a major stepping stone for the next session. Clear and simple: with good casting mechanics your casts are good!

First part of the presentation casts:

To catch fish successfully in a river with a fly rod, you must be able to control your line.

It is very important to understand line control and how your line and fly are affected by river currents. You will learn which casting techniques are needed to extend a longer drift, and a good line drift, plus a better natural presentation of the fly.

MARCH 4

Casting For More Distance
Plus, the **Second Part** of the February Presentation Casts

Most fly fishers want to learn how to cast farther.

Or goal is to help you to reach those previously "unreachable fish", adding 10 / 15 / 20 / even 30 ft (for some of us) to your cast! Some techniques are fairly easy to learn, while others are advanced and can take more time to master.

Note: The program for the clinics can be different depending on the group level you are in. The beginning casting level groups are more focused on good casting mechanics to create a good, solid cast.

Due to the high demand (and limited spots), you must sign up so early as possible to secure your spot for 1 or 2 sessions!

Other Upcoming Outings

January 24th to 26th Salinas River Striper and Surf Perch Outing.

The river is only open to fishing Wednesdays & weekends during steelhead season and the weekends are a zoo. So drive up Tuesday fish the river Wednesday fish the surf Thursday and head home. Here are details:

December 1st is the opening day of central coast steelhead fishing but stripers in the lagoons, like that of the Salinas, get just as much, if not more, attention. Though they don't belong in our coastal streams, they provide a much-needed recreational fishery when the steelhead aren't around. The thing to keep in mind is that, until the State and the Feds figure out striper-specific regulations for the coastal streams, they fall under the same regulations as steelhead with regards to season and special requirements. The season runs from December 1st through March 7th, ON weekends, Wednesdays and legal holidays plus the opening and closing days of the season regardless of the day of the week they fall on.

Additionally, even though you might be targeting stripers, you must have a steelhead report card in your possession. Two stripers of 18-inches or longer may be kept...and please do keep them.



You will have to fish from a float tube, pontoon boat, pram or kayak on the river as the shoreline is choked with tulles. Once in the water, your next task is to find the schools...but do so quietly as motors and loud splashing spooks them. Generally, the water isn't very deep so an intermediate or type 3 sinking line works fine. If you're using denser lines, you might have to strip the line in sooner rather than letting it sink deeper. For flies, the same patterns you use anywhere else will work here (chartreuse clousers and gurglers for top water.

Bigger surf and bigger perch up here so a 6 to 8 weight rod with a fast sink tip line short mono leader and weighted surf flies. NOTE CLUB HAS LOANERS IF NEEDED & A FLY SHOP IN CARMEL FOR FLIES.

The public fishing access directions: From Hwy 1, take the Del Monte Blvd. exit and, if coming from the south, drive straight to Monte Rd. If coming from the north, take the Del Monte Blvd. exit and turn left. The next left will be Monte Rd. Cross over the Salinas River and turn right onto a dirt road to the parking lot.

Eagle Canyon Trout Lake & Lower Sac Outing



Dear Members,

I am planning a trout fishing outing to Eagle Canyon Trout lakes on **March 15-16** and I need to know how many members are interested in going.

Eagle Canyon Trout fishery consists of two small sized lakes 20 miles east of Red Bluff in the foothills west of Mt. Lassen National Park. Stocked with rainbow trout ranging in size up to 15 pounds. We are given exclusive use of the fishery. No guides are included though available at an additional cost.

The second day is a full-day guided float trip on the lower Sacramento River for rainbow trout and possibly a few steelhead.

The cost for the trip is based on the number of members that sign up. We need a minimum of 4 anglers and can accommodate up to 8. The price is \$425 per person for 4 anglers, \$395 for 6, and \$375 for 8. We will need an even number of angler as the float portion of the trip is limited to 2 anglers per boat.

The gear should consist of a 5-6 weight rod with floating and sinking lines, waders, a float or pontoon boat, and a **BIG** net. Shore fishing is also an option though the chance of catching a really be trout will more likely come from fishing in deeper water. For the float trip on the Sacramento River the guides will provide all the necessary equipment.

Lodging can be reserved at the Holiday Inn Express in Red Bluff at \$98/night.

I hope you will consider going on this outing as you will not be disappointed. I will require a positive response as soon as possible along with a 50% deposit (depending on the number of participants) so I can secure the dates. The remaining balance will be due 30 days before the date of arrival. You can get complete information about the trip by logging on to the Confluence Outfitters website:

MANZANITA LAKE OUTING JUNE 18th - 24th

This majestic place with its snow covered alpine peaks and natural beauty, wild trout and quality fishing, bring us back year after year. It also attracts a lot of non-fishers, and because of this THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF CAMPSITES on the weekend and around the time of the club outing!

If you are interested, I urge you to RESERVE YOUR CAMPSITE NOW.

WHERE: Manzanita Lake: Lassen N-Park (north entrance). Take highway44 east out of Redding.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Camping near the lake (no hook ups). Motels are in Shingletown, about 14 miles toward Redding.

RESERVATIONS: recreation.gov or call 1-877-444-6777

Most members are camping in LOOP C. I am in site C-5

For those new to the lake: If you want to try to step up your still-water knowledge to a higher level, then Manzanita is the place to be!

Here is a fair assessment of what you can expect during your stay. In spite of the overall good fishing the lake is known for, it can also be challenging. Keep in mind that the 14" - 18" wild trout are catch and release, and at times, highly educated as to what they will eat. Speaking from my own experience, many of us have encountered situations when we individually tried to figure out what was going on with the fish. Was it the fly? The weather? Or was it simply trial and error? When you do figure it out, it can pay off BIG TIME. What some of us really like about Manzanita is it's one of the rare still-water beauties that can teach us a lesson and can challenge us to rise to the occasion to become a better still-water fly fisher!

The fishing is primarily done in 4 to 8 ft of water with long 12 - 17 ft leaders over submerged weed-beds. Most of us begin to fish mid-morning and stop by mid- afternoon. In general the fishing is slow between 3:30 and 7pm. This will give you ample time to have dinner and be ready for the evening fishing. If the fishing gods were not on your side during the day, you have still a good shot at great fishing in the evening. The lake comes back to life when the sun is going off the water around 7:30 pm. The dry-fly activity start at that time with improving results later in the evening until dark. During this low light period, the fish are much less picky and easier to fool, what was (for some) hard to achieve during the day is now working great. At the same time 8 to 9:30 pm, stripping a dark medium size seal or wooly-bugger can be very productive with a lot of violent strikes from mostly brown trout. This is a great way to end your fishing day. A floating device is the best way to go, however there are many good spots around this 80 acre lake which can be fished productively from shore.

TACKLE: 4 - 6 wt rod / floating line or hover line. 1 ips.

LEADERS: For Dry Flies 12 to 17 ft (including 3 ft 5 - 6x fluorocarbon tippet)

in low light hours 12 to 15 ft 5 - 4x fluorocarbon tippet

For Nymphs 12 to 16 ft 5x fluro (In low light hours 12 - 14ft 5 - 4 x fluro).

For Woolly buggers 12 to 16 ft 5 to 4x fluro (after 8:15pm 10 to 12ft 3 to 4 x fluro).

DRY FLIES: Parachute Adams, female Adams, Callibaetis, cripples, duns, emergers all in size 14 to 18.

Black Ants size 12 -14.

NYMPHS: Callibaetis / Gold Ribbed Hare's ear and flashbacks /Birds Nest/Pheasant tail, all in size 14-18.

Damsels, olive size 12-14. Chironomids in black or red size 14-18.

STREAMERS: Wooly Bugger (olive) during the day size 8-12

Wooly Bugger (black or dark brown) for late evening size 6-8.

**CA fishing license and life jacket is REQUIRED.

We plan again to have a daily short get together fish report at 5pm in site C5. We will talk about what was working, or not working, and if necessary come up with an adjusted fishing plan for the next day (very beneficial for the new to the lake).

A dinner get together can be arranged for Wednesday 6 to 6:45 in site C5.

I hope to see you at Manzanita.




